LSJ Direct-to-Major Pilot Program FAQs

- 1. What if I don't get in through the Direct-to-Major pilot program? Will I still have an opportunity to major in LSJ?
 - a. Yes, if you are not directly admitted through the pilot program you will be able to apply to LSJ through the regular admissions process. You can find more information here.
- 2. How many times can I apply to LSJ?
 - a. You can apply through the direct-to-major pilot program once. If you are not admitted through this process, you will have an opportunity to apply through the regular admissions process twice.
- 3. What does capacity constrained mean?
 - Capacity-constrained majors have additional requirements and selective screening, which may include an additional application process. Completing the minimum UW admission requirements does not guarantee admission to capacity-constrained majors. Most students apply to these majors after they are admitted to the UW.
- 4. What does social sciences coursework mean?
 - a. Social sciences, broadly, examine how individuals behave within society. Social science coursework encompasses topics including, but not limited to: anthropology, history, political science, international relations, law, economics, human geography, philosophy, etc. These fields are foundational to a liberal arts education and will be instrumental to help you succeed as an LSJ major.
- 5. When is the deadline to apply?
 - a. April 5th
- 6. When will I hear back?
 - a. The Friday of the 5th week of the quarter
- 7. What if I took LSJ 200 as a non-matriculated student, and did not get a 2.5?
 - a. If you did not receive a 2.5, you may not apply to LSJ through the direct-to-major pilot program. However, you may apply to LSJ through the regular admission process once you are a UW student. During this process, you are highly encouraged to collaborate with an LSJ adviser about your plan. You are <u>not</u> required to repeat LSJ 200 if you completed the course and received credit (0.7 or higher).
- 8. What if I took LSJ 200 as a non-matriculated student, am I still eligible to apply to the direct-tomajor pilot program?
 - a. Yes, if you took LSJ 200 as a non-matriculated student and received a 2.5 or higher, you are eligible to apply to the direct-to-major pilot program.
- 9. Why is this called a pilot program? (Will this direct-to-major process be offered in other quarters besides autumn?)
 - a. We currently do not have a direct-to-major option for students, especially incoming transfer students. We are hoping to use this pilot program as a test run to potentially be able to offer this permanently in the future. The success of this pilot program will determine if this direct-to-major process will be offered in other quarters besides autumn.
