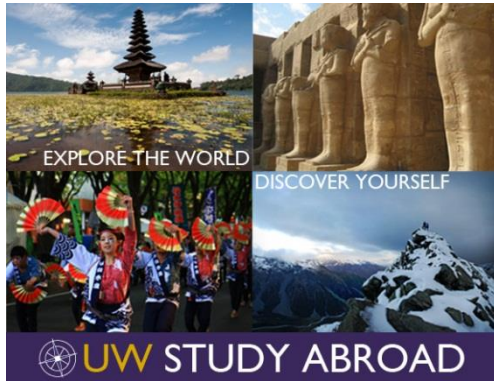


How to Earn LSJ Credit for Study Abroad!

Protocol for Ensuring LSJ Credit for Study Abroad:

- The best approach is to consult with the LSJ Adviser prior to selecting a Study Abroad program or prior to departing for your selected program. Together we can determine if/how your study abroad credits will satisfy LSJ requirements.



- Upon returning to UW, bring copies of all course syllabi to the LSJ Advising office (Gowen 42) so we can evaluate your transfer credits. You may also need to complete the LSJ Major Requirements Petition Form, available in the Advising Office. The LSJ Adviser will contact you once all credits have been evaluated. Please note that a course description is not sufficient. We need to have evidence of course readings and assignments in order to ensure the course was taught from an LSJ perspective.

- If you participate in an LSJ sponsored Study Abroad program, your credits will count for either the LSJ seminar requirement and/or one of the LSJ subfields. Please schedule a meeting with the LSJ

Adviser to adjust your degree audit once your credits have been posted to your transcript.

- Only UW-sponsored or UW-affiliated Study Abroad programs can be considered for fulfillment of LSJ requirements.
- A maximum of 5 study abroad credits outside of LSJ affiliated programs may be counted towards the LSJ Major or Minor.

UW-Sponsored & Affiliated Programs That *MIGHT* Count Towards the LSJ Major or Minor:

Please note: The list below is of study abroad programs with themes that may be of interest to LSJ majors and minors. Only the LSJ Amsterdam and LSJ Rome programs automatically count as LSJ credit. Students must follow the directions above if they wish to petition to have other programs count towards the LSJ major or minor. This is not a comprehensive list. Then follow the steps outlined above.
