	Meet with the LSJ Adviser to discuss your interest in honors, whether departmental honors requirements fit in your degree plan, and the process for applying. Come prepared to discuss potential thesis topics so the Adviser can assist you in determining which faculty may be best suited to serve as your Faculty Supervisor.	
	Write a project proposal of no more than two pages. This proposal should include a discussion of the research question you hope to answer and the data you envision gathering to answer that question. Please also explain how you became interested in the question and why you think it is important. This proposal is not intended to be a fully-developed research proposal, but a preliminary outline of what you anticipate trying to accomplish. **Students are encouraged to develop honors projects from previous work completed as part of a course assignment. In deciding whether to supervise your honors thesis, faculty will look at whether you have taken classes that support your research. The project proposal is meant to demonstrate to your prospective faculty supervisor that you are ready to do independent research of this caliber.	
	Select and print a copy of a research or analytical paper that you think best represents your writing, research, and analysis skills.	
	Print a copy of your unofficial UW transcript.	
	Set up an appointment with an LSJ faculty member who you believe would be the best fit to supervise your Honors Thesis. Bring this application, your project proposal, your sample research paper, and your unofficial transcript to your meeting. Be prepared to discuss your readiness for pursuing honors-level independent research, why this project is of interest to you, the feasibility of your project, and why you want to work with this particular faculty member on this project.	
	If the LSJ faculty member approves your project, ask them to sign in the box below. Make a plan with your faculty supervisor about next steps for your project. Discuss potential faculty to server as your Faculty Reader and determine what role the Faculty Reader will serve in your project.	
	Set up an appointment with any UW faculty member (graduate students are ineligible) who you believe would be the best fit to serve as your faculty reader. Be prepared to discuss your goals for the project and the support role you'd like a reader to provide.

Grading: The LSJ Honors Thesis is completed over two quarters, with 5 credits of LSJ 488 in the first quarter and 5 credits of LSJ 489 in the second quarter. The two quarters must be consecutive. These two classes are graded with decimal grades (not CR/NC), but the grade for both quarters is only assigned after completion of the second quarter, at which time the student receives the same grade for both quarters.
